Council Meeting
December 19, 2016**

MINUTES

Mayor Forrester called the Meeting to order at 9:00 am and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those in attendance.

Draft Agenda Review and Approval

Mayor Forrester advised that the purpose of the Special Meeting scheduled for 11:00 am today has been placed on this agenda as New Business Item 6b and questioned if Councilman Benton and Councilman Cerrato would discuss this item within this meeting instead of holding a separate Special Meeting. Councilman Benton and Councilman Cerrato both agreed to hold the Special Meeting as scheduled and to remove New Business Item 6b.

COUNCILMAN CERRATO MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS AMENDED. MAYOR FORRESTER CALLED FOR A VOTE AND THE MOTION CARRIED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE.

Minutes

Councilman Corbett requested that the November 15, 2016 Minutes be amended to reflect on page 2 that one of the points for the opposition to allowing cabanas was that no other communities within 100-mile radius allowed cabanas. Mayor Pro-Tem Scott objected to the addition as it was later discovered to be incorrect information. After a brief discussion, the Council reached a consensus to add the opposition point and to place in parenthesis that it was later discovered to be incorrect information.

MAYOR PRO-TEM SCOTT MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE NOVEMBER 7, 2016 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES, THE NOVEMBER 12, 2016 COMMUNITY MEETING AND THE DECEMBER 5, 2016 MINUTES AS WRITTEN AND THE NOVEMBER 15, 2016 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES AS AMENDED. MAYOR FORRESTER CALLED FOR A VOTE AND THE MOTION CARRIED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE.

Old Business

Consideration of Adoption of Revised 16/17 Fee Schedule to Include Bathroom Cleaning Fee for Special Events held in the Park

Susan Parker, Town Administrator, advised that the Special Events Policy will be revised to include language that would make to bathroom fee non-mandatory for low impact events.

COUNCILMAN CERRATO MADE A MOTION TO ADOPT THE REVISED 16/17 FEE SCHEDULE INCLUDING THE BATHROOM CLEANING FEE FOR SPECIAL EVENTS HELD IN THE PARK. MAYOR FORRESTER CALLED FOR A VOTE AND THE MOTION CARRIED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE.

Update of Hurricane Matthew Estimated Costs

Susan Parker, Town Administrator, provided the Council with an update of the preliminary costs incurred to date totaling \$295,852 with regard to Hurricane Matthew. Parker advised that some of this money will be reimbursed by FEMA and the State.

Consideration of Appointment of Fireman's Relief Fund Board Member

COUNCILMAN LARKIN MADE A MOTION TO RE-APPOINT LORI PEARCE AS THE FIREMAN'S REFIEF FUND BOARD MEMBER WITH A TERM EXPIRATION DATE OF JANUARY 2019. MAYOR FORRESTER CALLED FOR A VOTE AND THE MOTION CARRIED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE.

Consideration of Approval of Pine Straw Hazard Letter and Recipients

Richard Hathcock, GIS/Planner, reviewed the proposed Pine Straw flyer to be mailed to property owners, rental companies, business owners, emailed to the Sunshine List and placed on the website. The firewise landscaping website will be placed on the Town website. Mayor Pro-Tem Scott requested that Staff perform additional research for draft ordinances that ban pine straw and regulate the use of outdoor grills. The Council agreed to add a Pine Straw Hazardous Article to the Annual Report. Mayor Pro-Tem Scott will add additional language to the proposed flyer for Council consideration during the January Meeting.

Consideration of Approval of an Extension for the FY 2015/2016 Auditor Contract

MAYOR PRO-TEM SCOTT MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE 2015/2016 AUDITOR CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR FEBRUARY 28, 2017. MAYOR FORRESTER CALLED FOR A VOTE AND THE MOTION CARRIED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE.

New Business

Consideration of Approval of Request from Sea Trail to Remove Trees

The Council reviewed the request from Sea Trail concerning the removal of 193 non-heritage trees from the Maples Course. The Council discussed the need to have a certified plan and tree survey to ensure the proposed trees are actually on the Sea Trail property and not that of other property owners. The Council agreed to send this item to the Planning Board. Susan Parker, Town Administrator, will respond to the Sea Trail Owner and advise that the Planning Board is reviewing the request.

MAYOR PRO-TEM SCOTT MADE A MOTION TO DIRECT THE PLANNING BOARD TO REVIEW THE UDO LANGUAGE CONCERNING TREE REMOVAL REQUESTS BY GOLF COURSES AND TO WORK WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR AND THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT STAFF TO ASSIST WITH THE SEA TRAIL REQUEST INCLUDING

Consideration of Approval of Request from Sea Trail to Remove Trees (Cont.)

OBTAINING A CERTIFIED PLAN AND TREE SURVEY TO DETERMINE WHERE THE TREES ARE TO ENSURE THE TREES ARE LOCATED ON SEA TRAIL PROPERTY AND TO SUBMIT RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COUNCIL. MAYOR FORRESTER CALLED FOR A VOTE AND THE MOTION CARRIED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE.
